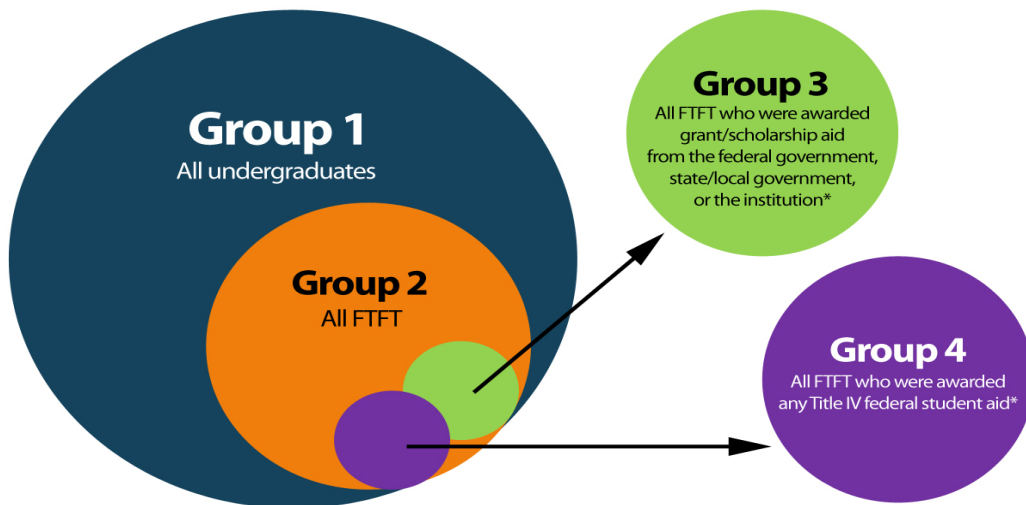

COA Revisions

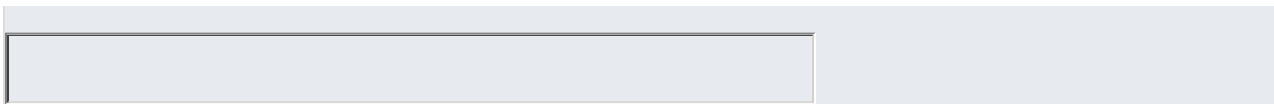
